

Student Health Centre: Fees and Charges for Private (non-NHS) Services

Travel medicine charges

Prescriptions

Prescriptions for existing health problems are provided as normal under the NHS but are limited to a maximum of 3 months supply. Prescriptions for anti-malarials and other items such as antibiotics which may be taken abroad in case of illness are charged at £10 each (and of course you need to pay the pharmacist for the actual drug).

Vaccinations

Most travel vaccinations are not funded by the NHS but some are free. The exact cost fluctuates so the following are guide prices: please check with us at the time of vaccination.

Vaccination	Cost	Comment
Typhoid	free	Need booster every 3 years
Hepatitis A	free	
Yellow Fever	£60	Single dose
Japanese B Encephalitis	£80	Per dose Two doses needed
Rabies	£45	Per dose Three doses needed
Meningitis ACWY	£50	Single dose
Hepatitis B [for travel]	£30	Three doses needed
Tick Borne Encephalitis	£10	NB cost of prescription only You need to pay for cost of vaccine to pharmacist 2 doses needed
